

in your life

Mothers, moms, women, daughters,

sisters, aunts, represent a group of people who have a significant influence on our lives. These women have filled the role of friend, parent, caregiver, listener, counselor, pastor, prayer warrior, guardian, encourager... so forth and so forth. Often we take for granted the role that the women in our lives have claimed. I mean we appreciate it, but we also take it for granted that all the little things will get done and the voids will be filled.

God used women through history as a way to shape the world; in fact I think it is good to remember what God said after creation, "It is not good for the man to be alone." Reality is that women have been influential and directed the course of individuals, businesses, religious organization, and nations. We can name names like Suzanna Wesley who shaped both Charles and John Wesley, the founders of our United Methodist Church, or Barbara Heck, who inspired Philip Embry to preach. We could look at women like Mother Theresa, Joan of Arc, Eleanor Roosevelt, Princess Diana, or Harriet Tubman, whose names have shaped our world history. But the truth is we need not look that far to know the influence of a woman.

My mother found herself faced with parenting 3 children by herself when she was 38. My father passed away and her kids (ages 6, 14, and 17) were at challenging ages. I was the high school senior facing my father's funeral and graduation in the same weekend. I still don't know how I made it through, but I know that it was my mother's strength and the support of family that pulled it all together. I often look back at all my mother did to influence my life, the lives of my two sisters, the challenges she faced, and the perseverance with which she faced every day, and I realize that none of us children would be who we are without her constant prayers, support, encouragement, and even discipline.

And I know that I am not alone. Each of you had a mother, grandmother, aunt, or sister who filled a significant role in your life. They probably faced a few challenges along the way to be there for you. But they endured. Maybe you are one of those women today who is persistently standing beside someone, and shaping them into the person they will be. I know it is not easy, but God has entrusted you with a great task. This month as we celebrate mother's day, I hope you will take a moment to thank that special woman in your life, and if you are that woman for someone, be blessed and know that God created you for that purpose.

Hosts buy or bake six to eight dozen cookies, and serve coffee and lemonade after the 9:30 contemporary and 10:45 traditional worship services. New Hope purchases three to five dozen cookies to also be served with the hosts' cookies. After fellowship time the hosts wash, dry, and put away the cookie platters, rinse out and dry the coffee canisters, and take the trash out to the trash bin. When you sign up to host, a letter from New Hope will be mailed to you before you host with instructions on how to host.

May Mission Focus: Our May Mission Focuses on 2 of our United Methodist Mission Schools in the U.S., <u>Redbird Mission School</u> in Beverly, Kentucky, and <u>McCurdy Mission School</u> in Espanola, New Mexico. Both of these Mission Schools are in high poverty areas with very high unemployment.

During May, you will find 2 giving trees in the Fellowship Hall, one for Redbird, and one for McCurdy. Take a gift tag and return with your check for the indicated amount in the offering plate. Both Mission Schools are experiencing low donations and may have to curtail some programs if not fully funded. This is how you can reach out and help them.



REDBIRD MISSION SCHOOL: Redbird has served the area around Beverly, Kentucky for over 85 years. Over the years, Red Bird Mission School has grown and changed to meet the needs of the local people. Thousands of students have passed through the doors of this Christian institution and have been profoundly affected by the high standards and goals.

The Mission was begun as an answer to prayer by the Evangelical Church, later the Evangelical United Methodist Church and when they merged with the Methodist Church,

the United Methodist Church.

Red Bird Mission has also worked to meet the health care needs of people in the Red Bird River Valley. Soon after teachers came, nurses and doctors arrived, making calls to mountain homes on horseback.

In 1975 Red Bird Hospital was incorporated and became part of the Red Bird Mission. In 2000, Red Bird Mountain Medical Center was renamed Red Bird Clinic, Inc., which still operates today as an out-patient ministry. McCURDY MISSION SCHOOL: McCurdy school had its beginnings after the 1862 Homestead Act. Its location and basic structure as a boarding school began one century ago in 1912. McCurdy School has continued to provide a high quality Christian-based education and now enrolls approximately 420 students. It now includes boarding and local commuting students.

The Española Valley is home to many people who commute to work to Los Alamos and Santa Fe. Housing is more affordable here, which is an important factor.

This fall, the school will become a charter school with an increase of United Methodist services available on campus: a Before and After School Program, Preschool, a mental health and counseling clinic, possible parenting classes, teen center, and summer enrichment camp.


Over the years, Memorial Day has become a big holiday weekend. It's now the unofficial start of summer, rather than a day of tribute to the departed it was originally meant to be.

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. - Romans 12:9

The first time I met anyone from North Carolina was when I was in seminary. She was a part of a group of friends I spent a lot of time with. She had this wonderful southern accent and when our group would part, she would say, "Y'all be good." I learned that it is an expression often used in the south, and had about the same meaning as my brother saying, just before we went to bed, "Don't let the bed bugs bite." It was just kind of a saying that you didn't take too seriously.

Yet the whole area of ethical decision, integrity, and character are very relevant today. News stories of failures in business ethics, political ethics, and personal ethics are rampant today. These are some examples of major ethical failures that we see in the papers where people have stumbled morally in major ways. But each of us, each day, make ethical decisions that impact our lives. And sometimes the temptation is not to make a difficult decision or do the difficult thing.

In the midst of the Watergate hearings, Senator Howard Baker was questioning a Nixon aide, Herbert Porter, about his decision-making process in the midst of that situation. Baker asked: "Did you ever have any qualms about what you were doing?" Porter answered, "I was not the one to stand up in a meeting and say this should be stopped." Baker asked, "Did you ever think of saying, 'I do not think this is quite right...?" Porter: "Yes, I did." Baker: "What did you do about it?" Porter: "I did nothing." When Senator Baker asked "Why?" Porter answered, "In all honesty, probably because of the fear of group pressure that would ensue, of not being a team player." Sometimes the most difficult ethical decisions are in the midst social pressure.

The movie "Hunger Games" is a fascinating movie in a number of ways. It is certainly an interesting study of ethical decision in the midst of a society that doesn't have many morals, and puts its citizens in difficult moral dilemmas. The plot of the story is that in some future society, a dictator government has taken over, and, for entertainment, forces each of 12 districts to supply a male and female teenager for what they call "hunger games," staged in a very large "arena" in which all the participants try to kill each other, leaving only one alive. It's a sobering, yet instructive story of trying to do at least some things right in that very imperfect environment. The story is very reminiscent of Christians making ethical choices in Nazi Germany, or in the midst of the Roman persecutions. Paul advised the early Christians, in the midst of a society that often immoral and cruel, to live a different lifestyle, a different kind of ethic: "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good..."
