Dear Precious Friends and Family!! Thank you so much for walking this recent journey in our lives! You may have heard that Elaine was diagnosed with a grade IV malignant brain tumor on the right side of her brain. It was originally about the size of a small baseball, affecting the left side of her body with stroke-like symptoms. We would like to give an update and clarify some misinformation that some may have. Grade IV is a way that the World Health Organization grades tumors for research and communication. This does not mean stage four cancer. Actually to the contrary, we are pleased to tell you that Elaine is healthy enough to have been accepted into a national research group investigating a new drug to help not only her, but others with the same kind of cancerous tumor. Tumor tissue collected during the surgical biopsy (which took as much of the tumor first), is now being sent to study sites across the country. Samples will be donated to other studies to further knowledge about other diseases of the brain such as Alzheimer's. Elaine's participation will be about one year, with 3-5 years of follow up before the

research is complete. God will determine the course of this and the results! We are completely at rest within His loving will. We are so honored to be a part of this and feel led by God to help others!

We hope you will join us in our iovous new life and explore with us how God is working in our lives and helping others, also. We are so happy and will give updates periodically. Elaine will soon continue with physical, occupational and speech therapy on an outpatient basis with On With Life in Ankeny. This has already helped so much in intensive rehabilitation in the hospital. Elaine is looking forward to being "kitchen trained" so she can cook again! Gary will be eating mighty well, and healthy!! Maybe we can work out some occupational therapy for Gary and his fishing skills!

While in the hospital, each prayer, thought, card, act of kindness and visit from all of you (and there were so many!) helped us to feel the steady hand of God on our shoulders. We have never felt his presence more! There are no doubts that God is good and will lead us the way we should go. We are honored and excited about what He has for us next!!

Thank you, Thank you, Thank you! You are truly the arms of Christ on this earth and in our lives! Sincerely and prayerfully in Christ, until we see you and can give a big hug---- Gary and Elaine Stubbs

New Hope. Right now it's not a big deal. We just ignore the detour signs and slip into the church. But we know that there will be a time when the road in front of us is a single lane and even more inconvenient. However we also anticipate the nice new

road that we will have when it is all done. We know that the challenges of today's construction will reward us "down the road".

During the month of June our sermon series will be on Tool Time, building our faith. During this series we will be talking about some of the steps that are needed to take our childhood faith from a

At the same time I want you to imagine the kind of faith that you have always wanted. Does it include more study or prayer? Does it revolve

around service and compassion? Are there questions that you have that need answered? Are there spiritual struggles that keep you from loving God or loving Neighbor?

This will be a fun series. You may even see some T.V. characters teaching you how to construct your faith.

June Mission Focus: (CFUM) Children and Family Urban Ministries

Our June Mission Focus is CFUM, Children and Family Urban Ministries located in Trinity UMC on the near North Side. CFUM is an Advance Special of the UMC because of its many exciting and varied programs that help with literacy, hunger, and enrichment of the lives of children and families that live near-by.



The Mission Committee is asking for help in collecting the following items for the backpacks to be given away. Please put items in basket on Mission Table. Donations can be placed in the offering plate with CFUM on the memo line.

PROGRAMS AT CFUM

The Breakfast Club is a year-round breakfast program for children, serving an average of 80 children during the school year, and an average of 60 children during the summer months. In conjunction with the Breakfast Club are the **Power Hour** where academics are supported, and the **Power Breakfast** where volunteers read and mentor students. **The Supper Club** provides an evening meal for 110-150 adults and children Monday-Friday and 40-60 adults and children on Saturday.

The Haven is an after school program offered to 50 children during the extended school year at Moulton Extended Learning Center (mid July- early June). Daily, it offers literacy enrichment and homework help along with recreational and creative activities for grade-school children. **Backyard Boyz**, and **The Whyld Girls** are gender-specific programs for middle school students.

Awesome Days takes place Monday through Friday during the Moulton school breaks. Educational components such as reading, writing, computer skills, math, art, cultural activities, and field trips fill the days.

The **Back-to-School Health Fair** is held annually in July. The fair offers physicals, dental and vision screenings, school supplies, and a tent-full of neighborhood agencies available for families with children returning to school

Friday Fun Night and Community Celebrations and a Winter Clothing Closet are other programs available.



We have set August 5th for our next on-site packaging event at New Hope. Put it on your calendar and stay tuned for our fundraising for the cost of the meals.



"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." - II Timothy 4:7

One of the fun things we did in the summer time was play baseball in the front lawn. We have a good-sized front lawn, had marked off the bases, and had a backstop to protect the house from wild pitches. We often would pretend we were Sandy Koufax, or Mickey Mantle, or Ted Williams. But I ran across the name of a guy we never pretended to be. He wasn't flashy, didn't get a lot of press at the time, but his record was a very impressive one. His name was Don Sutton. He played from 1966-1988. Only in one of those seasons did he have more than 20 wins. But on June 21, 1986, he won his 300th game, something only 30 pitchers had achieved up to that time.

Sutton once described himself as "a grinder and a mechanic." He didn't have the sparkle of a Sandy Koufax, or the sophistication of a Don Drysdale. Sutton himself said: "I've never considered myself flamboyant or exceptional. But all my life I've found a way to get the job done." Not a bad talent to have. In 1998 Don Sutton was voted into the Hall of Fame.

The Bible is filled with faithful people who just kind of were "grinders." They weren't flamboyant or sparkling. They were steady, they hung in there, they "kept the faith." Paul was one who knew how to "grind it out." In Il Corinthians he talks about how he hung in there, in spite of all kinds of difficulties he has been through. He talks about some of

them – 5 times he received 39 lashes, 3 times was beaten with rods. He had been battered with stones, shipwrecked, imprisoned, been on dangerous journeys, had sleepless nights, missed meals. But Paul says he discovered, even in those kinds of times, he could rely on Christ to give him the strength he needed.

Andrew is another example. He would never have been invited to speak at the Presidential Prayer Breakfast. But he introduced Peter to Christ, and it made all the difference. There was Epaphroditus. He never wrote anything in the New Testament, but he is described by Paul as his brother, co-worker, fellow soldier, and who ministered to Paul in his need over the years. He had staying power.

There are faithful folks today who do the everyday things in order to live out their faith. There are the Sunday School teachers who teach, week in and week out. There are the senior saints who have been faithful over the long haul. There are the everyday Christians who do the best they can to live out their faith each day in the decisions they make at work and the way they treat their fellow workers, the way they spend time with their families – all as ways to live out their faith in Christ. Sometimes the most faithful thing we can do is to faithfully do the small, the unexciting, the mundane, the everyday things, as faithfully as possible, in the name of Christ.
