New Hope United Methodist Church Ministry Fair

January 13 • After all 3 services

On January 13, 2013, New Hope will hold a Ministry Fair after all services. This will be your opportunity to learn more about the many activities that New Hope sponsors. The Ministry Fair is a good opportunity to talk with cluster leaders and committee chairs to learn about the various activities and how these activities may match your interests, spiritual gifts, and time availability. Not only is getting involved in a New Hope ministry a meaningful way to serve, but it's also a way to make new friends among our New Hope family. Below is a summary of the New Hope clusters and some of the activities associated with each of them. For more complete information, attend the Ministry Fair on January 13.

Christian Care: provides care and support to members in times of need. Examples include Prayer Chain, Card

Ministry, Home Shut In Visitation, and New Hope Needlers.

Missions and Social Outreach: provides materials and other support for people in need outside our congregation. Examples include: Angel Tree, Hand of Luke, Meals from the Heartland, Nothing but Nets, Bidwell Riverside, and UMCOR kits.

Worship: includes activities that contribute to the New Hope worship experience. Examples include Altar Guild, Music, Hand Bell Ringers, Technology, and Communion.

Children/Youth Education: activities that provide Christian education for our youth. Examples include Christian Learning Time, VBS, TGIW, Confirmation, Jr High Leadership, Sr High Leadership, and Christmas program.

Adult/Family: activities that

continue our Christian growth in adulthood and as families. Examples include Men's Fellowship, Women's Fellowship, Advent by Candlelight, Father-Daughter Dance, and Bible Studies

Evangelism & Membership: activities that foster evangelism and growing our congregation. Examples are: Visitation team, New Member Shepherding, Rummage Sale, and Beaverdale Days.

Johnston River of Life: all the activities related to our Johnston campus, including worship services, community outreach events, music, and others.

Trustees: provides activities that support our New Hope church facility and related functions, including grounds and building maintenance, landscaping, and kitchen.

Children's Ministries Mission Statement: A church family working together to teach children to know, grow, and show the love of Jesus Christ.

Children's Worship: Children's Worship is a meaningful time for children ages 3 years through 2nd grade to worship and connect with God. Children will participate in an engaging worship service geared just for them in the Sanctuary. The

service will follow a traditional format, with praise songs, prayers, joys/concerns, offering, scripture reading, and a message. We will include a time for fellowship at the end of our service where kids will gather back in the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} grade classroom and share in a healthy snack and have time to visit with friends. Christian Learning Time: We will be resuming "The Story" in January. Christian Learning Time will start up again on January 6, 2013, after a short Christmas break.

The first Sunday of the month we will be having donuts in CLT. This is an informal way of celebrating the breaking of the bread and sharing in fellowship with peers. Kids of Hope will now be "Bucket Fillers." Students will work to fill a bucket in their classroom. After fellowship time the hosts wash, dry, and put away the cookie platters, rinse out and dry the coffee canisters, and take the trash out to the trash bin. 

January Mission of the Month: DMARC

The Des Moines Area Religious Council (DMARC) is an interfaith organization of religious communities working together to meet basic human needs.

The rise in poverty has been accompanied by a growing demand for emergency food. Right here in Des Moines's metro:

- 68% of employed food pantry consumers earn \$8 per hour or less and just 7% earn \$10 per hour or more
- 87% have monthly household income of \$1500 or less (\$18,000/year)
- 1,540 households (4,300 people) borrow money to pay their rent/mortgage 2,860 households (8,000 people) will need to move to cheaper housing due to insufficient income.

DMARC has had to curtail the foods they give out each month because of insufficient donations. New Hope Missions donate \$100 each month to both the Urbandale and Johnston Food Pantries.

Because of the overwhelming need, the Mission Committee will match all funds given to DMARC in January by New Hopers. Please give generously.

makes a great opportunity to get acquainted!





On Epiphany Sunday, January 6, we celebrate the "Visitation of the Wise Men." The season of Epiphany also celebrates the bringing of the Good News to the Gentiles. The word "epiphany" means "to show." Manifestation is another word used to describe the meaning of Epiphany. It is the manifestation of the glory of God in sending Christ into the world. The emphasis of Epiphany is on the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. The Epiphany season has therefore become a time for the emphasis of the evangelism and the missionary task of the Church, and the living out of the Gospel in the world.

Wisdom is a good topic for us in January. For the Bible, wisdom is more than having a high I.Q. or the amount of education one has had. Wisdom is the art of living life well under God's sovereignty. Wisdom includes the ability to make great decisions and seeing God's work in the world every day.

The writers of the Bible treasured wisdom. In fact, there is a whole section of the Bible called Wisdom Literature. There are three books in the Bible that are categorized by most scholars as Wisdom Literature: Job, Proverbs and Ecclesiastes. Some of the Psalms can also be considered as part of the category of Wisdom Literature in the Old Testament.

Jesus also talked about the importance of having wisdom and its connection to faith. He talked about the five bridesmaids who were wise and the five who were foolish (Matthew 25:1-13). He talks about the faithful and wise servant, who the master had put in charge of the household (Matthew 24:45-51). Jesus says that everyone who hears these words of His and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. Wisdom is about hearing the Word and living the faith.

We will pick up the sermon series we are doing on "The Story" after a break during the Advent season. We will begin the January sermons with the story of King Solomon, who is known among the people of Israel as Solomon the Wise. We will then look at some of the wise and foolish decisions of some of the kings of Israel. For the Bible, foolishness is trying to live without God, trying to live by our own self-defined purpose, sufficient unto ourselves, and it can become very destructive. Wisdom is keeping God at the center of one's life.
