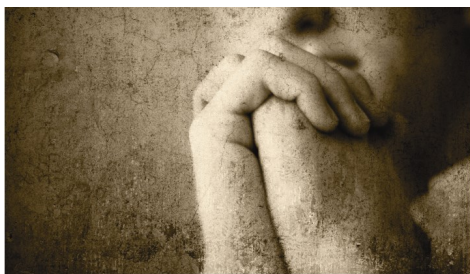

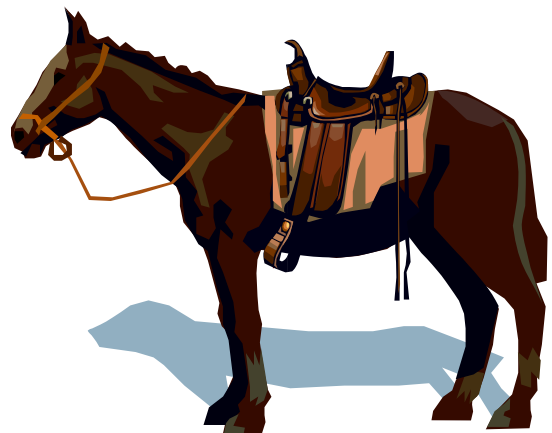

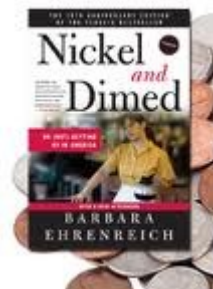

"Millions of Americans work full-time, year round, for poverty-level wages. In 1998, Barbara Ehrenreich decided to join them, inspired in part by the rhetoric surrounding welfare reform, which promised that any job equals a better life. But how can anyone survive, let alone prosper, on \$6 to \$7 an hour? To find out, Ehrenreich moved from Florida to Maine to Minnesota, taking the cheapest lodgings available and accepting work as a waitress, hotel-maid, house cleaner, nursing home aide, and Wal-Mart salesperson. She soon discovered that even the "lowliest" occupations require exhausting mental and physical efforts. And one job is not enough; you need at least two if you intend to live indoors"

Children's Worship (Ages 3 years through 2nd grade)

Thank God It's Wednesday (TGIW)

Our TGIW program is back in full swing and going well. It's not too late to sign up, just fill out the age appropriate registration form (found on the TGIW table in the Fellowship Hall) and turn in your \$5/child or \$10/family registration fee. This will help us cover basic programming costs.

TGIW is for K-5th graders. We start at 5:30 for a free will donation supper followed by three 20 minute rotations and devotions until 7:15. This means if your child isn't there right at 6pm, they may miss out on some of the activities.

REMINDER TO TGIW PARENTS: As of this school year, all children ages K through 5th grade will need to be SIGNED IN by a parent/guardian who drops them off, as well as SIGNED OUT. For your child's (children's) safety, we will no longer be allowing children to wait in the parking lot for their parents. We ask that parents please take the time to come in the door, sign in/out your child and find out what's going on and how you can be involved. All children can be picked up in the Family Life Center. Children will need to be signed out by a parent/guardian or leader of another program they participate in (i.e. puppets) for them to leave. This ensures the safety of all of our children at New Hope. 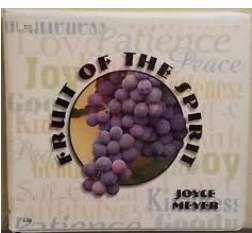

OCTOBER MISSION: THANKSGIVING INGATHERING

This event was created to collect items to send to places in the US and across the world that are in need.

The Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church is divided into 8 areas for gathering these kits. We will be taking ours to Greenfield, IA on November 1st. An auction of quilts and fine crafts follows a worship service, meal.

The money raised will go toward the following areas: Church World Service Tools and Blankets, Artemisia Seeds for treatment of Malaria, Heifer International, Self Help International Feeding Project in Nicaragua and Ghana, P.E.T. Personal Energy Transportation which sends Iowa made trike-like modes of transportation for land mine victims.

This year the Needlers are contributing a quilt for the auction. If anyone has any other items to donate, please contact Sharon Smith, 515-277-7125. New Hope is collecting materials for 3 kits this year: Health Kits, Sewing Kits, and Knitting Kits. You can place your items in the appropriate baskets on the Mission Table at the back of the Fellowship Hall.

UMCOR HEALTH KITS

- *1 new hand towel (15" X 25" up to 17" to 27")
- *1 bath sized bar of soap in wrapper (3oz. or larger)
- *1 large, sturdy comb (not pocket sized)
- *1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (no child-sized)
- *1 nail file or fingernail clipper (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- *1 new washcloth
- *6 band aids (3/4")

Lay out hand towel and lay washcloth flat in center. Place rest of items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Fold one end of towel over. Grasp bundle of items and roll over rest of towel tightly. Place tightly rolled bundle in zip lock bag.

SEWING KITS

Cottage industries often grow out of sewing classes where these kits are used to practice skills.

- *3 yards cotton or cotton-blend fabric (one piece)
- *1 sewing scissors
- *1 new spool matching thread (medium to large size)
- *1 package hand sewing needles
- *5-6 matching flat buttons on card or fastened together

Wrap sewing notions in fabric. Seal in zip lock bag.

IOWA NIGERIA KNITTING KITS

- *1 pair 10 inch needles, size 8
- *2 7-oz skeins of yarn (acrylic, same dye lot of a worsted solid color)
- *1 crochet hook, size E
- *2 yarn needles, size 16
- *1 pair small scissors, size 4 or 5

Place needles in skein or yarn and place in appropriate size zip lock bag

Baked goods should be transferred to a disposable container if possible.

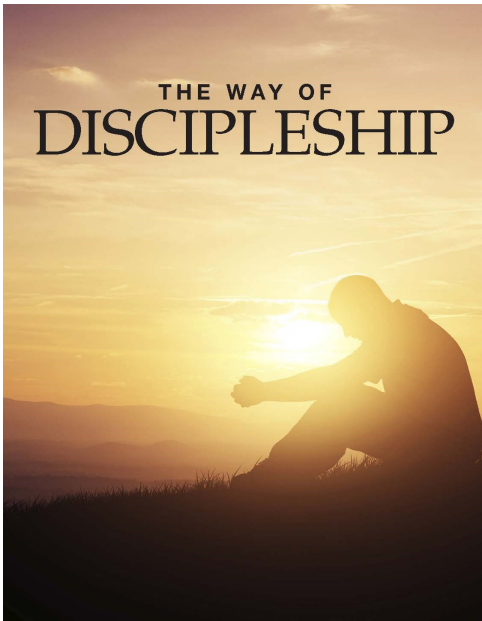
