




Instead of wrapping the gifts this year, we will focus solely on packing the boxes and writing the children who will be receiving them personal notes of encouragement/cheer. We strongly encourage children/individuals to bring \$7.00 to cover the cost for shipping a box (cash or check made out to Samaritans Purse is acceptable).

What can you do to help?

Sarah could use some volunteers on both of these days to help the children with their shopping and writing of notes. Consider pre-wrapping your box, or volunteer some time to do so. Contact Sarah to help with this.

WE NEED DONATIONS OF:

- * Empty shoe boxes lid and box wrapped separately or unwrapped (preferably pre-wrapped)
- * **Toys** that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.
- * **School Supplies** such as pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
- * Non-Liquid Hygiene Items such as toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.
- * Accessories such as t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.
- * A monetary donation to cover the cost of purchasing remaining gift items- check made out to the Missions fund with "Operation Christmas Child" on the memo line.

WE WILL NOT ACCEPT THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.



The Road Less Traveled

In High school I remember reading the poem by Robert Frost, *The Road Not Taken*. It begins, "Two roads diverged in a yellow wood." It seemed to impress upon me the value of recognizing choices when we encounter them in life, charting your own course in life, not following the easy road, but traveling the back road, smelling the roses, and enjoying the view along the way.

As I have matured I understand this poem in a new light. No matter how long we stand at an intersection staring down a path, we cannot what see lies around the bend or behind the trees. We only know the condition of the path in front of us, and often the fact that one road is more traveled imparts a feeling of comfort and safety. However, the less trodden path may offer the better view, it may be more desirable, but the fear of the unknown, of being alone on a path, often deters individuals from placing a foot on this uncharted course.

In life and faith Jesus tells us, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide, and the way is broad that leads to destruction." In this passage Jesus is teaching us that the easy way of life might actually lead us to an undesirable destination. It might be likened to believing you got on a plane to Cancun only to find its actual destination is Siberia. (Not that Siberia is a bad place, but you definitely packed wrong.)

At the closing of his poem, Frost ends by saying, "I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference." Choosing the narrow path of faith and action, and not the broad road of "I am a good person who goes to church every week," is a very different life course. The narrow road may harbor more challenges, more brambles, more rough steps, and a steep course, but I know anytime I have taken such a path in life, I have looked back and known, "It has made all the difference."
