

Meals from the Heartland is a non-profit organization that has packaged more than 89 million meals to feed starving people around the world and across lowa since 2008. Isaiah 58:10 says, "Feed the hungry and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness and the darkness around you will shine as bright as noon."

WOMEN AT THE WELL

New Hope is in the third year of our covenant relationship with the United Methodist congregation at the Mitchellville Women's Prison.

In the covenant, we promise to:

<u>Pray</u>: We pray weekly during our services and also promote prayer partners. Barb Mathers receives special prayer requests weekly from the women and places them on note cards near the Mission Table at the rear of Fellowship Hall. Pick up as many as you can pray for during the week.

Presence: We will be visiting their service on November 9th at their 7:00 pm worship service at the Women's Correctional facility in Mitchellville. Sign-ups will be in September and October.

Gifts: The Mission Team has committed to donate \$1 per member each of the 3 years of the covenant.

<u>Witness:</u> We have had 2 re-entry teams helping women re-enter society successfully. If you would like to join a team, please contact Sharon Smith. We can always use extra help as schedules change and not always can everyone participate. The team meets weekly for one year with the released woman to mentor and guide her.

"Come away...

To go on retreat is to take time away from the ordinary routine in order to immerse oneself in prayer and quiet. What is God calling you away from in order to draw closer to him?

...by yourselves...

Solitude is a time-honored spiritual practice. It differs from loneliness or isolation in that it is entered into willingly. Seek out a place where you can be alone, and savor the opportunity to be friend yourself and to place yourself in an awareness of God's presence.

...to a secluded place...

Thanks to technology, we seem to be living in a perpetual chat room. Silence is the sister practice to solitude. Set aside a period of time in which to turn off your cell phone and disengage from the computer. Revel in the quiet that ensues both externally and internally.

...and rest awhile."

Jesus' invitation to his disciples concludes with the enticing notion of rest. As such, it is a reiteration of Sabbath – a time in which to rest from labor. Consider what "belabors" you and how you might set it aside in order to rest quietly and peacefully in God's embrace.



Save the Date!

The South Sudan Mabaan Tribe will be joining us in worship on Sunday, July 9 for the 9:30 and 10:45 services. They be sharing their music during both services.

The Mabaan people come from the newest country in the world, South Sudan, and worship on Sundays at Epworth UMC in Des Moines. The pastor of the congregation is Rev. Aaron Limmo. This group comes from the White Nile State in the South Sudan which is near Ethiopia. Most people are farmers and cattle herders in this area.

Southern Sudan is called the "breadbasket" of the country as many crops grow there providing food for the family as well as some left over to sell in the market. This is not the case now as there is in-country fighting, turmoil, killings and attacks over land and oil. Many Mabaan people have fled into neighboring Ethiopia and live in refugee camps. A few Sudanese have been given the opportunity to be resettled in the U.S.
