New Hope and Johnston River of Life are gearing up for our 7th annual on-site Meals from the Heartland packaging event on August 13!

Meals from the Heartland is a non-profit organization that has packaged more than 89 million meals to feed starving people around the world and across Iowa since 2008. Isaiah 58:10 says, "Feed the hungry and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness and the darkness around you will shine as bright as noon."

This is a great opportunity to get your family involved in doing God's work! Invite extended family too, as well as friends and neighbors. You can all package together and have fun doing it! We will package 28,000 meals.

- Four Stations with 8-10 people each. Children are welcome and there will be chairs available for them to stand on. There will also be chairs for people to sit down while you package if you can't stand.
- Three Sessions:
 - 8:30 am with a short worship service, packaging from 9:00-10:00
 - 9:30 am short worship, packaging from 10:00-11:00
 - 10:45 am short worship, packaging from 11:15-12:15
- Donations: Any amount is welcome! If you would like to donate a box of 216 meals, the amount is \$45. Children may use the provided empty food bags for their "piggy bank" to collect their money. \$2,000 has been designated from Pastor Craig's Lilly grant to help fund this ministry.

Outdoor Service Sunday, August 6 8:30 a.m.



- 1 new hand towel (15"x25" up to 17"x27")
- 1 new washcloth
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. or larger); No Ivory or Jergens
- 1 large, sturdy comb (not-pocket-sized)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper, not child-sized
- 6 band aids (3/4"-1")

1 nail file or fingernail clipper (no emery boards or toenail clippers) Lay out hand towel and lay washcloth flat in center.

Place items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Fold one end of towel so it covers all items. Grasp bundles of items and roll over rest of towel tightly. Place rolled bundle in zip-lock bag. VALUE \$12 plus \$2 shipping

3 yards cotton or cotton-blend fabric (one piece)
1 sewing scissors
1 new spool matching thread (med. to large size)
1 pkg hand-sewing needles
5-8 matching flat buttons on card (in original package)



Many years ago now, Anita and I were able to join a group that went on a Wesleyan Heritage tour of Great Britain. The tour included a number of historical sites around Great Britain, but was especially focused on the places where the founder of the "Methodist movement," John Wesley, grew up, learned, lived, and ministered. It was my first (and as yet only) trip overseas and I was nervous.

It amazes me to think about all the settlers who left home and family over two hundred years ago to come the this "New World" by sailing ships. Without their courage and faith, we would not be here today. It reminds me of Abraham (then called Abram), who was asked to pull up roots to go to a new land: "Now the Lord said to Abram, 'Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you.' So Abram went, as the Lord had told him" (Genesis 12:1, 4). What faith it took for Abraham to leave country, kindred and home to follow God's call.

The followers of John Wesley also made such a journey, so that in 1784 the Methodist Church was established in this country. To go back and see where the Methodist movement all started was exciting (of course, I have to admit that I was a history major in college, so what may seem like watching paint dry to others is fascinating to me). To stand in the pulpit of the preaching house at Bristol, where John Wesley taught his lay pastors to preach, was a thrill.

What is also exciting is that, because of faithful missionaries through the years, we can go almost anywhere in the world and find a place of Christian fellowship and be reminded that we are part of God's worldwide family.

Let me also say that it is a privilege to be a part of the history of New Hope United Methodist Church. As I reflect on this history, I think of all the faithful pastors and members of New Hope who have carried on God's work before us. Our church is housed in a comfortable building, which I appreciate very much, but it is the work of God that goes on inside the building and then moves out into the world that is the key.

As the people who are the church, may we continue to learn and grow and minister, remember who we are and what we are called to do.

Some time ago I came across a definition of **vision** shared by Andy Stanley in his book, "Making Vision Stick." He said, "Vision is a mental picture of what could be fueled by a passion that it should be." He then went on to share that to make your vision stick it should be: stated simply, cast convincingly, repeated regularly, celebrated systematically, and embraced personally.

I won't try to unpack all of that here. Suffice it to say that New Hope already has a passion that a more just and equitable world should exist for all people and we are already engaged in making that happen within the sphere of our influence. We just need to be reminded of it, celebrate it and embrace it personally. Then we need to ask, "What more is there that could be that we have the passion to see that it should be?"
