




Bidwell-Riverside Center: We have new arrangements worked out for those of us who want to volunteer each month at Bidwell Riverside. We will work the **2nd Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.** Those who want to carpool should meet at the church at 12:30. Both women and men are invited (and urged) to come, as we will be the only group there. They need 2-3 to guide persons through the food pantry "grocery store" and help them make selections, 2-4 to sort donations, 4-6 to stock on Thursday afternoons (because a truck comes in that day), and someone to run the clothing counter. If a larger group comes, 8-10 can be kept busy unpacking in the Bed Bath and Beyond building.

Bidwell is a United Methodist Mission project which has been serving people in the Des Moines area since 1893. It is the largest DMARC food pantry in Des Moines and distributed more than 540,000 food items to families in need last year, as well as having a community garden. More than 6,000 clothing items are dispersed to families each month. Their child development center provides a quality education for 48 children, and family services include assistance with short-term emergencies and guidance to self-sufficiency. Clients are treated with respect and Christian compassion.

Thanks you to everyone who supported Senior High BLAST in February with our recent breakfasts and Ash Wednesday pancake meal. We were able to raise over \$900


between the events, which will go directly to support our Summer Mission Trip to Houston, June 9-16, in which we will be taking 13 people; 9 youth and 4 adults!!!!

MARCH MISSION NEWS

Our March Mission focuses are:

Habitat for Humanity and the

Women's Prenatal Shelter and Clinic at the Mutambara Mission Hospital in Zimbabwe.

<u>HABITAT FOR HUMANITY</u>: Our next Habitat Build is March 17, from 8am to 4pm. All levels of skills are utilized, so don't be afraid to sign up, a job will be waiting for you. THE WOMEN'S CLINIC AND SHELTER AT MUTAMBARA MISSION HOSPITAL IN ZIMBABWE:

Our Missionary, Emmanuel Mefor, and his nurse wife, Florence Mefor, in addition to running the hospital and doing surgery, created a clinic and shelter to lower infant mortality rates. Women who are in the last few months of their pregnancy are brought to the shelter, where they are monitored, fed healthy food, and taught skills such as sewing and knitting. The food they serve is bought from farmers in South Africa and near-by areas, so the cost increases with the addition of transportation expenses. They recently started a garden to supplement the food served, but the costs of fencing to prevent roaming animals of eating or destroying the garden is a problem. Other needs include repairs and painting of hospital wards and the shelter.

An average of 100 patients are seen daily in their Out Patient Department, however, Florence and Emmanuel also go out into the villages and countryside to check on patients.

We will be holding another "Noisy Can" collection Sunday, March 18, to help with this wonderful mission.

SOUPER BOWL REPORT: Thank you to all those of you who participated in our "Souper Bowl" food drive for the DMARC Food Pantries. A special thanks to Jackie Johnson for creating the posters and decorating tables, overseeing the counting of the items as well as delivering all to DMARC. We collected: 1,253 items! Our game was a HUGE success because of our wonderful New Hope family. Activities like this help our church tackle hunger in our community, one donation at a time. Philadelphia Eagles won the Souper Bowl with 698 points vs. the Patriots' 555 points!! Of course the REAL WINNER is the FOOD PANTRIES!

CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS: The camp booklets are out! Send your kids to camp for a wonderful, fun filled, and spiritual experience. Missions will continue to support ½ of the cost and if the cost is still too great, the UMC Conference also gives scholarships to help. 




Enjoy the Convenience of Electronic Giving

Easter & April Fools

I have heard a lot of humorous comments about the fact that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentines day and Easter falls on April Fools day this year. The fact is, it is neither rare nor common. In the last three hundred years this phenomenon has occurred 8 times. (1725, 1804, 1866, 1877, 1923, 1934, 1945, and 1956.) Easter is one of those odd holidays that fluctuates radically based upon the moon and the new year. Easter can fall anywhere from March 22nd until April 25th.

But lets not get lost in the mystery and rarity of when Easter falls on April 1. Instead, let's meditate for a moment on the monumental miracle of Easter morning that merits 2,000 years celebration. Maybe the disciples thought there was a prank being played on them. (of course there was no April fools at that time, and we don't know the actual date) But the questions were flying.

Why is the stone rolled away? Where is the body? What did they do with him? Is he really alive? How is this possible?

So many questions and so much doubt. There was confusion and fear. The disciples went into hiding, afraid their bodies might come up missing too. But as word began to spread, as disciples met Jesus on the road to Emmaus, others encountered Jesus in a locked room, and 500 heard Jesus give the Great Commission and ascend, the reality of the miracle began to take hold.

Today, 2,000 years later, we still celebrate the miracle of Easter. We may get excited about egg hunts and chocolate candy. We may love the Easter baskets, and Cadbury Eggs. Who knows, some of us may have a lot of fun with Easter on April Fools day. But the real miracle of Easter is found in the empty tomb, and the promise of Jesus' love. This Easter make sure you celebrate the miracle somewhere.

You may think I'm getting ahead of myself, but I want to talk about Easter. This year Easter is April 1, so, by the time you read the April newsletter, Easter will be upon us or will have already happened. So, let's talk about Easter.

What memories do you have of past Easters? My memories include: coloring Easter eggs (especially the smell of vinegar used to dissolve the color tablets); wearing my best or even new clothes to church (my sister always got a new hat--an "Easter bonnet"--and I was jealous); eating chocolate bunnies (ears first of course); eating jelly beans (trying to keep an even number of all the different colors); and eating Easter eggs (the ones we decorated ourselves tasted the best).



As an adult, I am embarrassed to say that my most significant memories of past Easters have to do with my annoyance at the lingering presence of green plastic "Easter grass." That stuff would keep showing up all around the house for months afterwards. Even through the fall and into the winter, we would occasionally come across a piece of Easter grass and I would cry out in shock and dismay, to the amusement of my kids. They loved to find some of the grass just to tease me with it and get a reaction. It may be that they had a supply of it and were "planting" it to torment me, but I could never prove it.

As I reflect on such memories, it surprises me that they are not very significant memories given the importance of the holiday. I realize that the biggest and most important Christian holiday has not held nearly as prominent a place in my memories as others, such as Christmas. Now Christmas is a very important Christian holiday (my favorite), but when I stop to think about it, the birth of Jesus would not be celebrated or even remembered if it weren't for what happened on Easter.

It is the Resurrection of Christ that makes his birth worth remembering. It's the Resurrection of Christ that makes our union with God and new life possible. It is the Resurrection of Christ that makes us who we are--Resurrection people.

So, what memories do you have of past Easters? I'd love to hear about your memories and any ideas you have for making Easter extra special. Please let me know if you have suggestions and stay tuned for the following announcement:
