World Water Day – March 22, 2018

Declared by the United Nations, and recognized every year on March 22nd. Attention is given to the importance of fresh water and advocates for sustainable management of fresh water sources. Recognizing the use of nature in reducing floods, droughts and water pollution. The Mission focus for April is water. The United Nations theme for 2018 is Nature for

Water.

Water demands:

- 2.1 million people lack access to safely managed water. The global water demand can be 30% higher by 2030 because the world's population will have grown by 2 billion people.
- Irrigation uses 70% of global water, for agriculture. 20% is used by industry, energy and manufacturing dominating. Domestic use is the remaining 10% with 1% of the 10% used for drinking water.
- 1.9 billion people live in water scarce areas. 3 billion people could live in these areas by 2030. Waste water contaminates water used by 1.8 billion people. 80% of waste water is not treated, as it flows back into various water ways.
- Water challenges for clean will be explored with the use of nature. Quantity and quality of water can be negatively affected because of damage to ecosystems. Nature can be used in cost effective and sustainable ways. Planting trees to replenish forests, connecting rivers to flood plains and restoring wetlands, are examples of how this can be done.
- Nature is a variable in the drought occurring in Cape Town, South Africa. The crisis comes from poor planning, bad crisis management, and 3 years of drought. In the, article from Time Magazine, February 19,2018, Cape Town's water supply will soon run out, due to drought. People are being asked to conserve. When the taps are finally turned off, daily rationing will be 6.6 gallons per day, per person. People will have to line up to collect their allotment.
- Some of the population, in Cape Town, are sharing water-saving tips on line and on the radio: Don't boil food, bake or grill, use paper plates, wrap serving platters in plastic so you can peel off after each meal, order pizza and eat straight from the box, shower over a plastic tub and use the water to wash clothes, keep a bowl in every sink to collect water from handwashing using this water and laundry water to flush toilets.
- The author of this article, Aryn Baker, is living in Cape Town. The author thinks he could survive on the 6.6 gallons of water a day. He has started taking only 2 showers a week and using handiwipes. He is looking at using dry composting toilets and will be adding rain water tanks to his terrace.
- War is a disaster which threatens adequate water supplies. Saudi/US bombing has targeted hospitals, schools, factories, seaports, electrical power stations, and water treatment facilities, in Yemen. Water borne diseases like cholera and diphtheria are likely to spread because of the bombings. This information is from Methodist for Social Action

John 4:10-14 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds. Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Bidwell-Riverside Center: We have new arrangements worked out for those of us who want to volunteer each month at Bidwell Riverside. We will work the **2nd Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.** Those who want to carpool should meet at the church at 12:30. Both women and men are invited (and urged) to come, as we will be the only group there. More than 6,000 clothing items are dispersed to families each month. 

APRIL MISSION NEWS

UNITED MISSION TO NEPAL INTEGRATED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT is our mission project for April. Missionary Kathryn Parker, spoke to us over _a year ago about her work in Nepal. This project is for setting up much needed new classrooms —carpet, tables, book shelves, story books, educational toys and materials, a water filter, and bright paint. <u>It costs about \$300 to do this and the mission Team has committed to supporting one classroom.</u> *** We are challenging the congregation to match our contribution.

MUTAMBARE WOMEN'S PRE-NATAL SHELTER AND CLINIC: Thank you for giving again via our "Noisy Can" collection to our Missionary, Emmanuel Mefor's clinic and shelter for expectant moms. Emmanuel and Florence's work is invaluable in reducing the infant mortality rate in their district in Zimbabwe.

SAVE THE DATE: August 12th will be our 8th annual on-site Meals from the Heartland packaging event at New Hope. We will soon begin our annual fundraising for the cost of the food materials and transportation. Sign-ups will begin in June.

STAY TUNED FOR AN EXCITING OPPORTUNITY TO BE INVOLVED IN UGANDA WITH HEIFER IN-TERNATIONAL PARTICIPATING IN A CHICKEN PROJECT. The Mission Team has been working with Heifer International to help in a project of gifting chickens and selling eggs to support a community and remodel a church building. One of our members, Patrick Kyenkya, who attends the 10:45 service with his wife, Banny, has been a contributor and mentor to members of his village and church, and thought chickens would be a daily source of money for them for their projects, and also help them to become independent. We have raised an Ark before, which is \$5,000, but this time we would like to solely support buying chickens. The money we raise will also support Heifer's personnel in educating and supporting the village as time goes on.

UMAFASHA has a new name and purpose! This immigrant group from several central African countries has been empowered to become a tax exempt service organization for Iowan immigrants and refuges from Africa. It is renamed <u>African Immigrants and Refugees Transition Services (AIRTS)</u>. The services they plan on providing include: tutoring, multilingual advocacy, interpretation and translation services, ESL classes, driving lessons, assistance with immigration paper work, assistance with government benefit applications, and housing and employment assistance. Their mission is: "Helping African Immigrants and Refugee families acquire skills they need to function effectively as workers, students and community members".




Enjoy the Convenience of Electronic Giving

I felt a little foolish realizing how I had stood there offering my wonderful prayer while the subject of it all had simply fallen asleep. But then, I decided my prayer had served its purpose, for what better way to bring peace and comfort to someone that helping them get some rest.

I have realized it is not what we say, but simply being there that is important when people are hurting. The greatest difficulty is not in knowing what to say to those in need, but in keeping quiet and offering them your presence.

When Job, in the Old Testament, suffered so greatly after losing all he had, three friends came to comfort him. They sat with him for seven days and seven nights without saying a word, "for they saw that his suffering was very great" (Job 2:13).

If you are in need or know of others in need, please let me know. If there are those who would like to receive communion in their homes, please let me know as well. Also, remember to offer others the gift of your presence.

Now, if you're having trouble sleeping, let me know and I'll say a prayer for you. It works better than a sleeping pill.
