

### **January 2019 MISSION NEWS**



JANUARY MISSION FOCUS: DMARC is our Des Moines' area Food Pantry system, under the auspice of the Des Moines Area Religious Council. Our Mission Team UNITED TO MEET THE NEED has decided to continue contributing to the Johnston Partnership and Urbandale Food Pantry, \$100 each per month from our Mission funds, as we have the last few years.

In addition, our congregation has faithfully donated food items, and money to the greater food pantry system monthly.

As you know, the numbers of food insecure families rose sharply in the last few years, so the need for food and money donations continues to balloon. New Hope declares the third Sunday of each month: Food Pantry Sunday. We highlight that Sunday to encourage and educate our congregation about this special program and it's needs. **UGANDA CHICKEN PROJECT:** As of the date of this writing, we are only short about \$200 toward our \$5,000 goal! Very exciting! 

**Greeters** arrive at worship service fifteen minutes early to welcome worshipers.


**Lectors** read the scripture lessons for the day at the worship services.

### **Lessons in wise faith**

"The Magi teach us true faith," said Martin Luther. Given the obstacles they encountered, we would understand if they had given up altogether!

First, the travelers were "off the mark," coming to Jerusalem to seek a newborn king in a "royal palace." Then, directed to Bethlehem, the wise men found a sight "so utterly out of keeping with a king" — a poor young woman and child, in a "poor hut" — that one might expect them to head straight home. "But," declares Luther, "with a great, strong and full faith they ... follow the word of the prophet and the witness of the star in all purity of heart," bowing to worship and honor the Savior.
