First Fridays With The Kids!

We will be cancelling our April 3rd First Friday event in light of the current social distancing recommendations. At this time we still plan to hold our May gathering, but will update as the date approaches.

Our March gathering was all about SPRING! We planted sunflower seeds and talked about how seeds grow, just like our faith in God grows! We investigated different kinds of seeds to see what characteristics they had. Then we made seed art with lots of different seeds - our art turned out beautiful, just like the church is made beautiful with the many different people that come together to form the whole! At the end of our time together we enjoyed dirt cups for a snack. Want to make your own? All you need is a chocolate pudding cup, crushed up Oreo cookies and gummy worms. Yum!

Since we won't be gathering together this month we invite our families to try this activity from the March 2018 edition of *Share Faith* magazine:

In the Tomb, Out of the Tomb

Supplies: masking or painters' tape

Place a long piece of tape on the floor to divide the playing area. Designate the right side of the line as "in the tomb" and the other side of the tape as "out of the tomb." Stand on the "out of the tomb" side, and have the child face you while standing in the "in the tomb" side of the line. When you call out either "in the tomb" or "out of the tomb," the child should jump to the side you have called. Make it extra challenging by picking up the pace, and calling out the same side several times before switching. You can also make it tricky by pointing to one side while calling out the other.

*Give your child a turn as the caller! *Involve the entire family for more fun! After the game, take time to talk about the meaning of Easter as a family and why it is celebrated.

For further extension of the concept for kids try making *Resurrection Rolls* as a family.

Resurrection Rolls Recipe

Ingredients:

- 1 can refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 8 large marshmallows
- Melted butter
- Cinnamon
- Sugar

Directions:

- 1. Give each child one triangle shaped section of crescent roll. This represents the tomb.
- 2. Each child takes one marshmallow which represents the body of Christ.
- 3. Dip the marshmallow in the butter and roll in cinnamon and sugar mixture. This represents the oils and spices the body was anointed with upon burial.
- 4. Lay the marshmallow on the dough and carefully wrap it around the marshmallow.
- 5. Make sure all seams are pinched together well. (Otherwise the marshmallow will "ooze" out of the seams)
- 6. Bake according to package directions.
- 7. Cool.
- 8. Break open the tomb and the body of Christ is no longer there!
- 9. Celebrate God's love!



We were fortunate to be able to meet twice in March before Spring Break and social distancing.




Endowment Endeavor


