




Baseball Family Night ~ Friday, August 5th @ 7pm

FREE LITTLE FOOD PANTRY NEEDS YOU. New Hope is in partnership with Meredith Drive Reformed Church to help provide free food for the neighborhood. The Free Little Pantry is located between 51st and 52nd Streets north of Meredith Drive and is used daily. New Hope has agreed to provide food for one day a week in the pantry. Our day is **Monday**, and we are to supply around 20 food items. These items may include canned meats, canned fruit, canned vegetables, peanut butter, cereal, rice, grains, dry beans of all types, Ramon Noodles, soup, Chef Boyardee products with meat, spaghetti sauce, spaghetti noodles, pasta, etc. Only non-perishable foods and no expired food products.

Your help is needed to: Bring a donation of one food product (or more) each Sunday to New Hope and put on our pantry shelf located by the Welcome Center in the hallway. A grocery check list is on the pantry shelf to assist you in your shopping.

Sign up for a Monday to take 20 food products from the pantry shelves at New Hope and deliver to the Free Little Food Pantry. There is a clipboard with the sign-up

sheet on the shelf. You can pick out your 20 choices on Sunday and deliver any time of the day on Monday.

Des Moines Area Religious Council

This year has been an exciting time for the Des Moines Area Religious Council (DMARC). On May 12, 2022, it celebrated 70 years of service and 46 years of the Food Pantry Network. In March it moved from 1435 Mulberry Street. The new headquarters, located at 100 Army Post Road, **Des Moines, IA 50315,** offers the following benefits: greater storage capacity in the



warehouse, indoor parking for the mobile food pantries, more office space for DMARC's staff and volunteers, community and training rooms, a new volunteer center and an on-site food pantry that will open in July.

DMARC currently has 14 physical food pantry sites, three mobile units that serve 30+ locations. During the first three months of 2022, there was an increase in visitors to DMARC's Food Panty Network, including a 10.7% increase in March. One of the advantages of the move to Army Post Road is that DMARC has significantly more space to store food. This will lead to enhanced efficiencies and cost savings by allowing them to order greater quantities of food in bulk and to accept larger food donations.

Would you like to help? There are several ways. One is to donate food items. New Hope UMC has a Red Barrel located in the Fellowship Hall. There is a list of most needed items on the table by it. Please make sure to check the "Best Buy" date on the item to make sure that it has not expired. Another way to help is to make a monetary donation. You can help feed the hungry any Sunday by making your check out to New Hope UMC and putting DMARC on the memo line before placing it in the offering plate.

Another exciting means of giving is donating the surplus from your garden. Donations of garden produce allow families to experience fresh, healthy food items that otherwise may not have been available to them. You can drop off produce at DMARC's warehouse, 100 Army Post Road from 8am to 4pm Monday through Thursday and from 8am to 3:30pm on Friday.



Would you like to do something different and help others? Consider volunteering at DMARC. There are many ways to volunteer such as sorting food items, helping in the food pantries, assisting in the office, etc. You can choose what works out for your schedule. It is a lot of fun and a chance to make new friends. I have volunteered in the UNITED TO MEET THE NEED office, the warehouse, on mobile food pantries and physical food pantries. I enjoyed each


