

Sunday, October 9, 2022, at 12:00 noon. You need to be physically present for your vote to count.

College-age and Young Adults - September 18<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m.

This Resolution on Inclusion is a vote on a ministry in our own context. Thank you for taking time to read and pray with us as we discern together a faithful response to what is being proposed for the sake of Christ's Church.

## A RESOLUTION CLAIMING NEW HOPE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH AS ONE CALLED TO INCLUSIVENESS

Whereas, the mission of New Hope United Methodist Church is "Following Christ, inspiring minds, loving hearts, serving hands and impacting communities."

Whereas, "We affirm that all persons are individuals of sacred worth, created in the image of God. All persons need the ministry of the Church in their struggles for human fulfillment, as well as the spiritual care of a fellowship that enables reconciling relationships with God, with others, and with self." (Social Principles 161.G. of the UMC Book of Discipline)

Whereas, we praise God who formed our inward parts and knitted each one of us in our mother's womb. We praise God for we are fearfully and wonderfully made. Our frames were not hidden from God's eyes. (Psalm 139: 13-18)

Whereas, "We affirm that God's grace is available to all. We will seek to live together in Christian community, welcoming, forgiving, and loving one another, as Christ has loved us and accepted us. We implore families and churches not to reject or condemn lesbian and gay members and friends. We commit ourselves to be in ministry for and with all persons." (Social Principles 161.G. of the UMC Book of Discipline)



FREE LITTLE FOOD PANTRY. Thank you to everyone who has

**donated** non-perishable food items for the Free Little Food Pantry. The need continues to grow and for the month of August we will increase to **30 food items per week.** This will only be possible with your continued donations to the Free Little Food Pantry.

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED TO: Bring a donation of one or more food products each Sunday to New Hope and put on our pantry shelf located by the Welcome Center in the hallway. These items may include canned meats, canned fruit, canned vegetables, peanut butter, cereal, rice, grains, dry beans of all types, Ramon Noodles, soup, Chef Boyardee products with meat, spaghetti sauce, spaghetti noodles, pasta, etc. Only non-perishable foods and no expired food products. A grocery check list is on the pantry shelf to assist you in your shopping.


