

#### Our source of Light

January 6th marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world. Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:


Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The



flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What more perfect Father could there be! —Catherine of Siena (c. 1347-1380)

Epiphany beckons us to come to the light of Jesus Christ. Epiphany calls us to stare into that light until our inner darkness is fully expunged. Epiphany then sends us out into a dark and weary world as women and men with shining faces, until we say with the apostle Paul, "It is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" [see 2 Corinthians 4:6].


Hand of Luke ~ New Hope has been providing a monthly meal to Central Iowa Shelter & Services (CISS) for almost 25 years!

The location of the shelter has changed over the years, the number of people served has changed, the process of donation of food for the meal has changed, but the perseverance of the congregation of New Hope to furnish a meal on the 14<sup>th</sup> of every month has not changed. Thanks to the many people over the years who have served and kept this mission going.

Hand of Luke is a ministry of New Hope that provides an evening meal on the 14<sup>th</sup> of each month to CISS. Volunteers for this mission can help in several ways:

- Make monetary donations, and/or donations of supplies needed to prepare the meal
- Be part of the team that prepares the meal at the church (3-5 people)
- Transport the food to the shelter (2 vehicles)
- Serve the meal to the Shelter's clients (4-6 people)

The coordinators for Hand of Luke are Patrice Webber and Arlene Dabill. Each month, the link to an online signup is included in New Hope's monthly newsletter.



Typically, the meal prepared feeds around 250 people, which includes the clients of the shelter, and walk-ins. Last month (December 2023) food was prepared for 300 and 400 people came for the evening meal! Clients at the Shelter include not only homeless men and women of all ages, but homeless families as well.

Please consider volunteering a couple hours of your time to be a part of this mission!

The East Entrance was designed and built for two primary purposes;

- 1) to keep you safe and dry during inclement weather,
- 2) to enhance the east door as the primary entrance into the church building. I notice it is used very little for the first purpose.

Please consider using this beautiful addition for the safety and comfortability of your loved ones! As we enter the winter months the canopy could save someone from falling and provide parents with babies and/or young children a quick way to get from the car to the inside of the building.

Thanks all of you who have given \$\$ toward this building addition. The loan balance currently is \$41,443.

In January, we will begin our "Can You Spare a Dollar?"

campaign. This new campaign will help New Hope to reduce our East Entrance loan payment period from 14 years to 4 years. Please watch for additional infomation in early January.


