Women at the Well – Fresh Start Women's Center

We are once again providing a meal at the Fresh Start Women's Center on **Tuesday, September 24.** Please check the signup clipboard in the Welcome Center if you would like to help with this meal or contact Jolene Harlow, 515-490-8813, or rdharlow@earthlink.net.

Women at the Well began a satellite ministry at Fresh Start during the pandemic when it was not possible to get inside the prison where the primary ministry happens. A weekly program is offered at Fresh Start called "Well Time" that features bible study, worship and small group support for the reentry journey of women in transition from jail or prison.



A feeding ministry offers a home-cooked meal to the women twice a month, on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.

Fresh Start is a 48 bed facility run by the Department of Corrections for women in the justice system. It is a work-release facility so everyone there is required to leave during the day to go to work and earn their keep. Meals at the center are only offered once a day and come from the men's facility: old and cold. They appreciate a nice meal prepared with the love and care that many of our partner churches are known for.

The mission of Women at the Well is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Our vision is to lead the church in love that breaks down walls.

The children will start out in service at the children's table and exit to Sunday School with Jackie after announcements. The Children's Message time will be moved to the close of service, just before the benediction and


will be an opportunity for the children to engage in sharing what they learned in class that day.

Where did the summer go? It is crazy how fast this summer has gone by... It seems like we just got back from our weeklong Summer Games University Camp in Grinnell, Iowa last week! However, summer is over and it is time to start planning our 2024-2025 BLAST season at New Hope.



This year, we are going to try something different on Wednesday nights... We will be joining both Junior and Senior groups together to share a common opening lesson and then break into smaller groups for discussions. McKayla and Jenn will be leading the small group discussions; we are hoping to break the groups up by Junior BLAST (6^{th} through 8^{th} Grade) and Senior BLAST (9^{th} through 12^{th} Grade).

We are going to start our Wednesday night get together by doing a 4-week study from the Gospels and Old Testament on God's Promises. We will be doing this by relating this to a video game, you expect to face challenges and make mistakes, but there's always a way out. If things get too difficult in the video game, you can just turn it off and start over. However, in real life it's not so easy for us to recover from mistakes or start over when we face challenges, but Jesus gives us a chance to restart - no matter how difficult our circumstances are.



In this 4-week study from the Old and New Testaments, we'll look at a few people who needed God's help to give them a restart. From their stories, we'll discover four promises from God we can trust:

- When we feel like a failure, God helps us restart.
- When we feel overwhelmed, God takes care of us.
- When you ever feel stuck, God gives you guidance.
- When you ever feel unwanted, God says you belong.






Help Needed with Maintaining the Gardens



~ From Pastor Amy ~

My siblings, what help is it if someone says they have faith, but they have no labors? The faith itself can't rescue anyone, can it? -James 2:14

This month opens with Labor Day weekend! Let's race into fall by talking this month about the John Wesley's first General Rule: Do no harm. As you know, Wesley had 3 General Rules to live by. The early Methodists were expected to learn those rules by heart. For Wesley, this was where the rubber of our faith met the road. Knowing what is right, learning about scripture, studying our faith was not enough. Eventually, there must be action.

As we race into Fall, what will it look like when the Rubber Meets the Road? It will look like doing no harm! We are going to follow the lectionary through a large section of James and a few chapters of Mark. These are going to help us learn to do no harm as we commit to memory the first General Rule.

The "James" identified as the author of the Epistle of James was most likely (there are other theories, but most hold to the majority view) the brother of Jesus, known to be a pious Jew, although not a legalistic Jew as some Jewish leaders in the gospels are depicted. He was given the name "James the Just," because of his strong Jewish convictions. These are clear in this letter, as well. James was just because he was a very good Jew, and he witnessed the resurrected Christ, which changed everything about his outlook, but nothing about his faithfulness to his Jewish roots.

Pastor Wendy and I had a short conversation about this recently. Sometimes the Passion texts can give us the wrong ideas about First Century Jews. They were not all legalistic. They were not all anti-Christian (in fact, most Christians during the time of this epistle were referred to as Jewish followers of the Way, not Christian). Most of the Jews of the day were just everyday people striving to be kind, to love God deeply, and to be true to what their experience of faith has been. James, brother of Jesus, was one of those Jewish followers of the Way. As we read through James, look for the clues that James is trying to be faithful to the scriptures of the Old Testament and also true to the reality of the resurrection, and that he is most likely speaking to others who are similar in belief to him. This is a welcome portrayal of Jewish Christians and faithful Jews of the day who are definitely in contrast to the Jewish leaders from the Passion scriptures. It is important to notice this so that we understand the sin in taking the sin of on member of a group of people and projecting that upon all of the people. There are good and bad people in every bunch. James is a devout, yet open and non-legalistic Jewish follower of the Way. While he still can come across as a bit old-fashioned, remember that he died in around 80AD. That is just going to sound old fashioned no matter what!

James is also very consistently harsh to the rich and very compassionate to the poor in his letter (credit to Raymond Brown). This is likely less of a general criticism and more of a window into what the church must have looked like in his time. Imagine a dualistic environment where people are becoming divisive with their side-taking and entitlement. I know that is a stretch for us, but try to imagine! (OK, that was good old fashioned sarcasm!) We can learn a lot from James because in many ways, the church he is speaking to and the world we are living in are quite similar. The church then was polarized, and the ones suffering because of it seemed to be the poor. James pushes the church to put their faith into practice so that the suffering of the poor might end. I wonder if we can ever learn to lay aside our differences for the sake of those who are suffering from our polarizations today?

I don't want to give it all away, but it is good to know some background as we begin this series. I can't wait to get those motors running and put the rubber to the road this coming month! Just like James, I am confident that we have it in us to turn this "competition" into a race we can all win. We don't often spend a lot of time in Mark or James, and this will be a great way to see Wesley's General Rules in light of our own world view, and start to shape up! In the end, when the checkered flag flies, I hope we all cross that finish line together, having learned more about doing no harm!
