





So remember the heights from which you have fallen, and change your inner self—your old way of thinking, your sinful behavior—seek God's will and do the works you did at first when you first knew me."
-Revelation 2:4-5a (AMP)

Fall is always a "back-to" season. Kids go back-to school. Teachers and those who have had vacations over Summer go back-to work. And the church goes back-to, well, learning! Bible studies are restarting, Sunday School is restarting, and it is a great time to remember our roots.

Our September series is a back-to-our-roots-in-faith kind of series. "Heresies and Theology" tells the story of some of our most basic Christian beliefs that stem from the early days of Christianity, and reminds us why they matter. We will begin on Communion Sunday by remembering the importance of sacrament and our theology behind our practice of sacraments. Then, on "Holy Cross Sunday," which is a lesser-celebrated day in the church year for most Protestants, we will look at Iconoclasm and the symbol of the cross, as well as the difference between a cross and a crucifix. On the 21st, we will dip our toes in the waters of confession and forgiveness, and the theology of grace. Finally, on the 28th, we will examine where the heresy of the hierarchy of sin comes from, and our theology of humility.

Along the way this month, we will enjoy prayers from our Hymnal, some dating back to our founders in the faith. We will enjoy some old favorite hymns in our traditional services that call us to task in our theology. In our contemporary worship, we will sing songs that remind us that just because a song is contemporary does not mean it doesn't have deep theology! These songs might be newer, but they are filled with meaning and scripture.

Whether you have heard of Nestorianism, Iconoclasm, Transubstantiation, Memorialism, Atonement, or any of the theological words that trip us up or not, the truth is you are practicing theology in your life every day! This month is a chance to break down a few of the basics in order to truly understand why we do what we do in our worship and our faith. For many we will be refreshing and reframing. For others we might be learning for the first time. Either way, this will be a wonderful back-to time for us all!

I thank God for the chance we are given over and over again to come back-to God. May we leap into a Fall of learning this September! Don't be afraid to ask questions and help each other with your own stories of faith. I can't wait! May we all come back-to faith this Fall!
