





Women at the Well – Fresh Start Women's Center

Women at the Well began a satellite ministry at Fresh Start during the pandemic when it was not possible to get inside the prison where the primary ministry happens. A weekly program is offered at Fresh Start called "Well Time" that features bible study, worship and small group support for the reentry journey of women in transition from jail or prison. A feeding ministry offers a home-cooked meal to the women twice a month, on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.

Fresh Start is a 48 bed facility run by the Department of Corrections for women in the justice system. It is a work-release facility so everyone there is required to leave during the day to go to work and earn their keep. Meals at the center are only offered once a day and come from the men's facility: old and cold. They appreciate a nice meal prepared with the love and care that many of our partner churches are known for.

The mission of Women at the Well is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Our vision is to lead the church in love that breaks down walls.

Pecan Pie Bars By Dawn Bachelder

Crust

1 ³/₄ C. Flour ¹/₂ C. Sugar ³/₄ C. Butter

Topping

2/3 C. Packed Brown Sugar 1/3 C. + 1Tbs. Flour ½ tsp. Salt 3 Eggs 1 Tbs. Vanilla 1 ½ C. Dark Karo Syrup 2 C. Chopped Pecans

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, 325 degrees for glass.

Grease 9 x 13 pan.

For the crust mix flour, sugar and butter together. Press into 9 x 13 pan. Bake for 20-25 minutes.

For the topping mix thoroughly the flour and brown sugar. Stir in the eggs, vanilla, Karo syrup.

Let this mixture stand for 15 minutes while crust is baking. Stir occasionally. Mix in pecans in and pour over the hot crust. Bake an additional 35-45 minutes.






- Four Grief Booklets are sent to parishioners periodically during the first year after the loss of a child or spouse.

- Our **Service Men and Women** are remembered throughout the year with birthday cards, gifts and other items to make sure they know we are thinking of them.
- New Hope **Needlers make** lap quilts, and a care team member delivers to homes and hospitals of parishioners who are experiencing severe illness and or surgery
- Blood pressure checks periodically during the month on Sunday mornings in the Narthex.

- Commission on Archives and History ensures that the historically significant record of Conference, agencies, and local churches are collected and preserved for the future.
- Commission on Christian Unity and Interreligious Concerns fosters stronger interfaith communities with our neighbors of other religious traditions. Encourages our congregations to work with Churches Uniting in Christ.
- Commission on Ministries with Persons with Disabilities strives to heighten awareness of disability issues in the Iowa Annual Conference and in local United Methodist Churches. Provides seed grants for accessibility to buildings and activities.
- Commission on Religion and Race monitors, evaluates, advocates, to enable the church in all levels to pursue and achieve racial inclusivity as a way of life.
- Commission on the Status and Role of Women advocates for women so they may claim their rightful place within the church and in society.
- Council on Age Level Ministries (Older Adult Council and Young Adult Council) encourages the church to include all ages in planning, implementation and participation, programs.
- Council on Youth Ministries provides opportunities for youth to hear and respond to God's call by developing strong Christian leaders and helping local congregations develop strong youth ministries.
- Matthew 25 Fund provides grants to mission and ministry programs within each district to assist local congregations in engaging directly in hands-on ministry which propels us as the body of Christ towards the Kingdom of God.
