




In October, we had the church furnaces checked for the upcoming winter. We have two furnaces that will need to be replaced.

The response to the Social Action Committee's request for **coats for the Johnston Partnership's clothing closet** has been great. Thanks to everyone who has donated winter wear. The coat drive continues through the end of November, so it is not too late to donate your winter coats.

The dates for the **meals for Fresh Start** have been set for next year. They will be the third Tuesday of January, April, July and October. Some money has been budgeted to provide these meals but historically we rely on donations of food to accomplish this action.

Due to the never ending issue with food insecurity and the shut down of food assistance (SNAP), we have increased the food that is going to the Free Little Food Pantry from 50 items a week to 70. The congregation's donations to this very important mission is so very important. We are grateful for this support.

The **diaper drive** in October ended up providing the Partnership with 30 packages of diapers.

This is our monthly ministry of preparing a meal for the Central Iowa Shelter and Services. Patrice Webber and Arlene Dabill lead this ministry. 


Care Ministry Team

Bring your machine, current project and sewing notions. If your sewing machine isn't portable, we have two in the church closet you may use for the day. We also have fabric available for quilts.



IT'S EASY TO GIVE SECURITIES TO THE CHURCH!

As we all think about our year-end gifts to the church, consider donating securities from your investment portfolio. The church can accept any negotiable securities: stocks, bonds, mutual fund, ETFs. A gift of securities benefits the donor two ways: you receive the usual charitable tax deduction, and you avoid capital gains tax on the sale proceeds. This strategy is particularly useful if you have owned the assets for a long time and/or have a large unrealized gain.

To get this favorable tax treatment, it is important that the securities are given to the church **before they are sold**. Securities can be transferred from your brokerage account to The Iowa United Methodist Foundation. The Foundation will sell the securities at no cost to either the donor or the church and write a check to New Hope. Proceeds can be directed to the Endowment Fund or whichever church fund you specify.

If you wish to learn more about donating securities, call the church office; they will connect you with the Foundation and provide the necessary documents.

A Holy Pilgrimage to Bethlehem

We are traveling with Mary and Joseph on the path to Bethlehem this Advent. As we do, we journey in a few stages. Some happen concurrently, overlapping in wonderful and challenging ways, while other phases of the journey will feel a bit more lonely and isolated. The first week of our Advent journey leads us to Restoration and reshapes our expectations, although this process will overlap throughout the season. The second week, we will stand as a signal, even sometimes when we feel like the only one leading in that direction. How can we mark the trail for those who follow?

The second week will find us looking to the children who will lead us at 10am with their annual Christmas program.

Our third week reminds us that our journey may be hard, but there is always joy because this is God's highway! The purpose of our trip is to welcome Christ into our lives, which is always joy!

Finally, on the fourth week, we are learning to recognize the signs God sends us so that we stay on the right path. Mary and Joseph could have stopped in Jerusalem, but that was not the path God chose. We must follow God's signs and not just take the shorter road. And we will keep journeying until we arrive on Christmas Eve to the unexpected straw bed of the manger.

No pilgrimage is complete without scripture. Let me suggest some readings to enhance your journey. These readings are called the Psalms of Ascent. They are the psalms that pilgrims to Jerusalem would sing on their challenging journey.
