



The cost for the sign is \$35,225.60. We will also need to include electrical work of ~\$2,000.

### How is this being funded?

\$9,515 will come from Memorials

\$795.39 was donated/deposited on December 17, 2025

**\$10,310.39 total so far** which covered the deposit of \$10,112.80.

### How will we raise the rest of the cost?

\$26,915.21 is needed (includes electrical)

-10,000.00: We have a generous donation coming in toward the sign.

### \$16,915.21 left to fundraise.

1 - 8 oz. Package cream cheese - room temperature

1/2 cup of shredded sharp cheddar cheese

½ cup chopped cranberries

1/4 cup chopped pecans

2 large flour tortillas

Mix all the ingredients except the flour tortillas. Spread mixture evenly over cream cheese mixture. Roll tightly in plastic wrap. Refigerate 4 hours or over night.

Classes start on January 5, 2026, and will run until February 9, 2026.


This six-session study will take place on Monday evenings, from 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm, via Zoom.


Is any clutter in the way of your friendship with Jesus?




### **Sleeping Mats/Loom**


### The weavers had a great year in 2025!

Right before Christmas we started our 11th sleeping mat. If you are new member or just learning about this New Hope Mission, we weave 6 foot long mats out of recycled grocery bags. The mats are given to homeless people in our city and provide a dry barrier from the cold, wet ground. Each mat prevents over 500 plastic bags from going into the landfill!

Right now we have plenty of white bags cut and ready to weave. We would however, take your colored grocery bags as they add a pop of color to our mats. 
Last year we had a work group join us for volunteer hours. We had a great time and can accommodate about 8 people. If your work place or service organization is looking for a project or team-building activity contact us.



### A New Year, A New Hope

New Hope is our name for a reason. When we first began, we were planted by Grace UMC as a new hope in this corner of the Des Moines Metro. But we were not just a new hope for the community back then; we were challenged to be a new hope for this community in every new time.

A lot has changed since then: we have seen this side of Des Moines grow. We were able to grow with it. We expanded our building with additions and improvements that continue even today. We grew a new congregation as the community grew Northward: Johnston's River of Life! We grew programs and saw changes in staff and in members. We grew our ideas and learned more about scripture and its call in our lives to respond with love. We changed to meet the changes around us.

We now find ourselves in a unique season of life as a church. The world has changed greatly, but the church has made only small changes. Some even recoil at those in the churches of our current time. While we have tried to be more flexible than most, we still feel the sting of stillness amidst the rush of modernity. The world is moving around us like water around a stone. A force will always work to drive the stone downstream, sometimes moving it gently and other times tumbling it forward in clumsy head-overheels jolts. But often, when it refuses to yield, the water breaks the boulder down and carries off the willing sand that yearns to move forward. Still other times the stone moves and leaves pebbles still wedged stubbornly in place. To say bit biblically. We teeter between a brood of vipers fleeing the wrath to come (Matthew 3:7), and a



stiff-necked and stubborn people who are always resisting the Holy Spirit. (Acts 7:51). What shall we do?

John Wesley, an Anglican priest in his lifetime, would have said, look for the "via media." That was what Anglicans in the Reformation called their perspective of neither Catholic nor Reformed. Instead, it is a place where we can look carefully at the stream around us and plot our own course by using scripture, reason, tradition, and Christian experience to help guide us. That way, we neither tumble uncontrollably nor plant ourselves stubbornly or even try to move backwards upstream, but instead we navigate the waters.

This month and part of next, in the season of Epiphany, the season when we celebrate the enlightenment of the church and world, we will pause to look around and navigate the waters. We will be diving into three texts to accomplish this. First and foremost, we will be reading from scripture, using the lectionary readings of the season of Epiphany. The second text is also an old friend, *Three Simple Rules*, by Bishop Rueben Job. The third and final text we will be hearing from is *Building Beloved Community: The Courage to Love*, written by the current United Methodist Council of Bishops. We will be hearing also from our old friend, John Wesley. This series will challenge us to understand how scripture can lead us through this difficult stream of the world while still remaining faithful to the intent of scripture as illuminated by tradition, Christian experience, and reason.

We shall walk, or perhaps swim, with some of the giants of our faith, from Jesus, Stephen, and Paul, to past and current Bishops, as we sort out the best way for us to navigate this life. I hope you enjoy our Epiphany series as much as I am enjoying the preparation! Epiphany is indeed a time of joyful enlightenment. May we all be blessed with God's wisdom as we grow in faith! And may we truly claim the New Hope that is waiting for us in this new year!
