Coming on Ash Wednesday to the entire congregation:





Recipe of the Month: Southern Chicken & Wild Rice Casserole

Ingredients

1 (2.25-oz.) package sliced almonds
1 (6.2-oz.) box Uncle Ben's long-grain and wild rice mix
1/4 cup butter
2 celery ribs, chopped
1 medium onions, chopped
2 1/2 cups chopped cooked chicken
1 (10 3/4-oz.) cans cream of mushroom soup
1 (8-oz.) cans chopped water chestnuts, drained
1/2 cup sour cream
1/2 cup milk
1/2 tsp. table salt
1/2 tsp. freshly ground pepper
2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese, divided
Cooking spray
1 cup soft, fresh breadcrumbs



Directions

Toast almonds: Preheat oven to 350°F. Bake almonds in a single layer in a shallow pan for 4 to 6 minutes or until toasted and fragrant, stirring halfway through.

Make rice: Prepare rice mixes according to package directions.

Make casserole filling: Meanwhile, melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat; add celery and onions. Sauté for 10 minutes or until tender.

Stir in chicken, next 6 ingredients, rice, and 1/2 cup cheese.

Spoon mixture into a lightly greased 9 x 13-inch baking dish.

Top with breadcrumbs.

Bake casserole:

Bake at 350°F for 35 minutes.

Sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup of cheese, and top with toasted almonds.

Bake for 5 minutes.

Connect with things our Sunday School class is talking about from the Simply Loved curriculum:

God is always with us, and he helps us stand strong!

You never know how strong you're standing until someone surprises you with a shove. Maybe you're carrying a loaded tray across the lunchroom and someone accidentally bumps you. Welcome to a milk and spaghetti cleanup! When you know a push is coming, it's easier to stand strong. But if you really want to stand strong, be sure someone has your back, keeping you steady.

Jesus had the back of the sick people he healed. The hurt people he comforted. The dead people he brought back to life. And he had your back when he hung on a cross.

When you stand with Jesus, you stand strong. When you're pushed, you won't be shaken. Because he's with you, always there to offer support.

Try this at home: Stand with your feet planted firmly. Ask someone you live with to put a hand on your shoulder and give you a gentle shove. What happens?

Then stand with your back firmly against a wall and ask for another shove—a harder one this time. You'll go nowhere. That's what it's like to stand when God has your back.

PRAY: Dear God, thank You for always being with us. When life pushes us, help us stand strong. Thank You for having our backs and loving us every day. We trust You, Jesus. Amen. ☺♥

A Busy and Impactful January!





- Pray for our sale to be a blessing to our community, for our outreach to touch lives, and for the money earned to be put to good use.





Sleeping Mats/Loom

If you are new member or just learning about this New Hope Mission, we weave 6 foot long mats out of recycled grocery bags. The mats are given to homeless people in our city and provide a dry barrier from the cold, wet ground. Each mat prevents over 500 plastic bags from going into the landfill!

Right now we have plenty of white bags cut and ready to weave. We would however, take your colored grocery bags as they add a pop of color to our mats. Please, no Walmart bags as they tend to tear when we weave. Please watch the Link and our Sunday announcements as to when we need more plastic bags.

Last year we had a work group join us for volunteer hours. We had a great time and can accommodate about 8 people. If your work place or service organization is looking for a project or team-building activity contact us.

We weave on the first and third

Thursdays of the month from 1 -2:30 in a Sunday school room and even occasionally on Mondays after chair yoga. We can teach anyone how to weave and cut the bags for future use. Weaving is not limited to just Thursdays.

For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or comeliness that we should look at him, no beauty that we should desire him. -Isaiah 53:2

Imagine the image of Jesus. Many of us think of an old 1940s painting by Sallman or perhaps an even older portrait of Jesus with a beautiful face and long flowing hair. We rarely consider the only actual description from the Bible found here in Isaiah 53. The author here describes Jesus as nothing pretty to look at. Yet, he is described as the one who lays everything down for us. That, friends, is beautiful!


Lately, there has been a lot of controversy about people who don't look quite like us, whether because of race, gender, or age. Many in our nation seem to be confused about the criteria for being loved. If someone is too dark, they must be a hardened criminal. If someone is too effeminate, they must be less. If someone is too educated, they must not have any common sense. If someone looks too poor, they are not of the same value as someone who looks rich. We place a lot of value on the outside of a person.

1 Samuel 16:7 reminds us, though, "The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." We want to make Jesus look prettier because in our minds, only a pretty face could do for a face of God. But Isaiah 53 tells us otherwise. Jesus was not beautiful the way we see beauty. Jesus, though, is the most beautiful of all for his unfailing love, even in the shadow of his own cross. The same holds true for all our neighbors. God never chose people because they were pretty on the outside. God chose all the heroes of the faith, including us, for our hearts. And for our hearts to be beautiful, we need to see others with new eyes.

I can't tell you how often I have been told that poor people are scary. Guess what? They are just people. I have been told that strong people are scary. Guess what? They are just strong. I have been told by someone that when you are out of town you can't use checks because the "Mexicans" behind you in line will look at your address, beat you home, and steal everything. How can Christians live in that kind of fear, thinking that people who don't look a certain way are scary and bad? Travel has taught me this: wherever you go, people are people. Some are sweet. Some are tired. Some are grumpy. And some are full of hopefulness.

As we close our series of New Hope at New Hope, may we not forget what true beauty is, and may others look at us as people of hopefulness in a world filled with fear, so that we can be people of love instead of people of misplaced judgment. For to be more like God, we must see more than the outward appearance, more than any hatred propagated by our fear, and more than the acceptance of things we would never tolerate on a day of peace. May we see one another like God sees us, like God saw Jesus. And from that image, may we find our hope as we shift gears into Lent.
